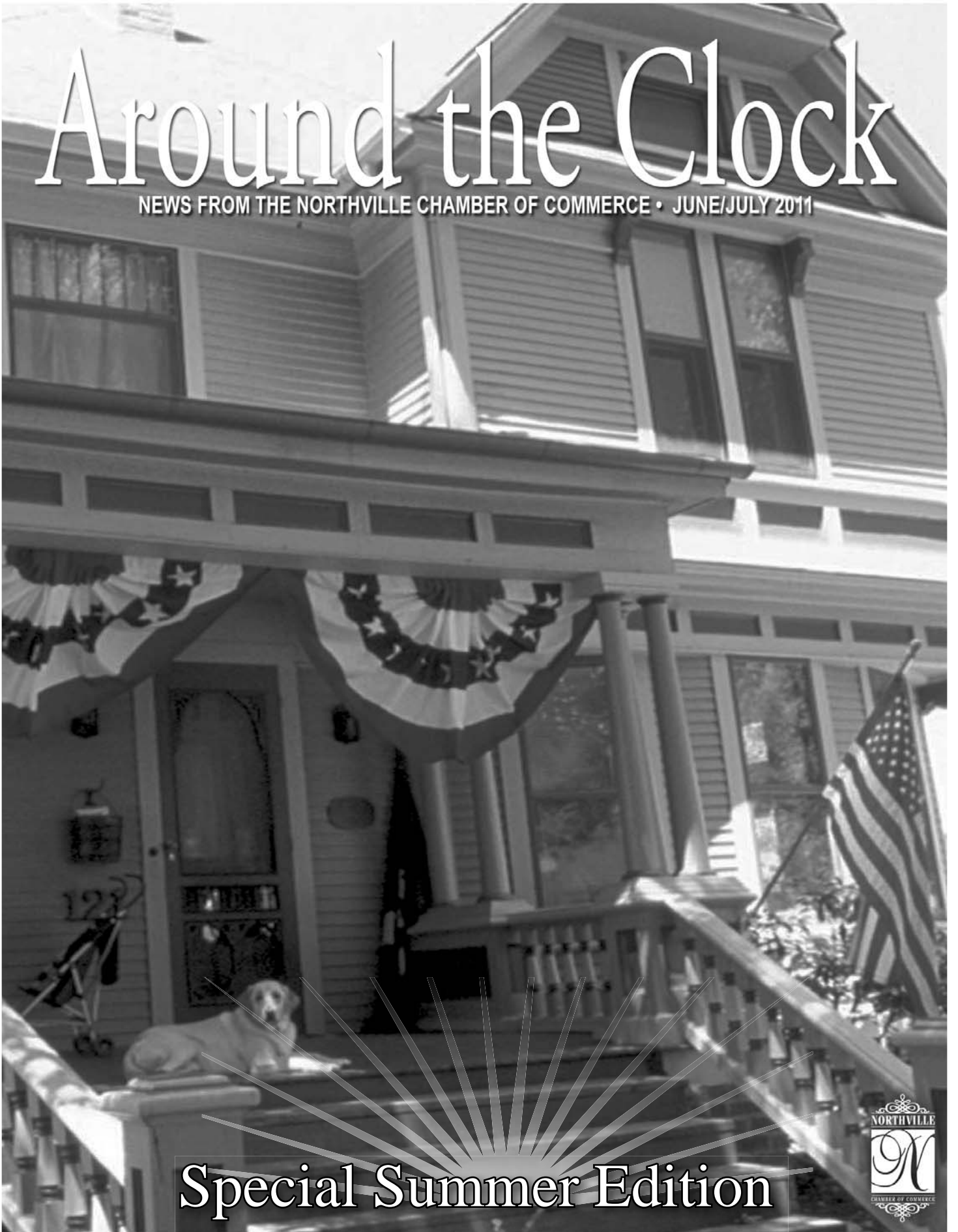

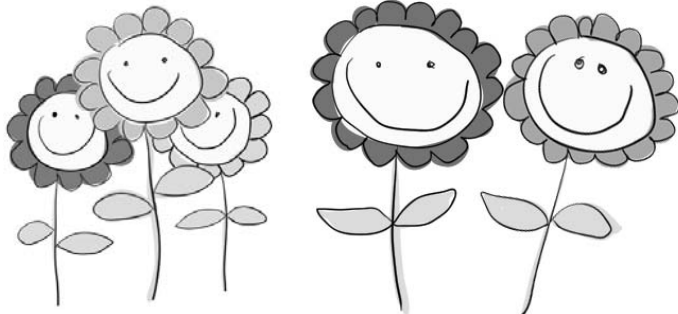

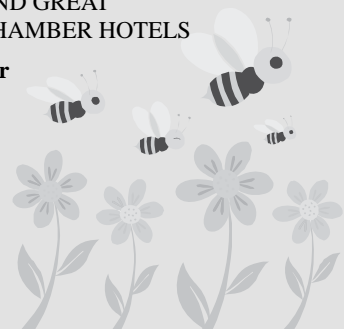

Crimes of the Heart

May 19 through June 25, 2011

Sisterhood is at the core of the Tipping Point Theatre's final show, Crimes of the Heart, in a season highlighting great American plays and playwrights. Babe Magrath has shot her senator husband in the stomach and doesn't want to tell her lawyer why in "Crimes of the Heart," a black comedy of family strife that won the 1981 Pulitzer Prize for Drama and the 1981 New York Drama Critics' Award for Best American Play.

The drama begins when Babe's sisters Meg and Lenny – who have issues of their own – join her at their Old Granddaddy's home in Hazlehurst, Mississippi to cope with this latest incident disrupting their thoroughly dysfunctional lives. "I love that in the midst of some pretty sad and dark family drama, you find yourself laughing out loud," says Hallie Baird, who plays Lenny, the sister who stayed around the family home to take care of their grandfather. "I really think everyone will relate to at least one character or relationship."

As the story continues, old resentments come out, quirky relatives appear and each sister is forced to face the consequences of the "crimes of the heart" she has committed. The result is a funny journey through their struggles, their rivalries and ultimately their bonds.

The curtain rises at 8 p.m. Thursdays through Saturdays, with matinees at 3 p.m. Saturday and 2 p.m. Sunday at the theater at 361 E. Cady St. Tickets are \$28 to \$30 for adults and \$26-\$28 for students and senior citizens. Tickets go on sale April 26 and will be available by calling the box office at 248-347-0003. The Show will run from May 19 - June 25.

- Explore images of park features that could be included in the new master plan
